
CAREOF BRASS INSTRUMENTS FOR BETTER SOUND EASE OF PLAYING & ACCURATE TUNING


1. Take special care of the mouthpiece. Rinse thoroughly after use. Remove any dirt with mouthpiece brush or toothpick.

2. Clean the valves frequently when instrument is new — in order to remove the microscopic bits of metal that wear off as you break in the valves. Do this daily for the first two or three weeks, even if the valves seem to work satisfactorily.

• Wipe valve casings dry by pulling a clean, lintfree cloth through them.




Wash pistons and dry with clean, lint-free cloth. Never use cleaning rod for cleaning portholes; their corners are sharp and easily dented. Just draw the cloth through the portholes to remove dirt and moisture.



Once a month, flush out the entire instrument. Remove mouthpiece and tuning slides, unscrew valve caps and remove valves from casings. Flush interior of instrument with lukewarm water (NEVER HOT), scrub bore with special flexible wire bristle brush, rinse with cold water, and drain it thoroughly.

Apply Selmer Tuning Slide Grease to the tuning slides before reassembling the instrument.





■ Apply Selmer Valve Oil freely to each piston and return pistons to their casings.
